Best Practices-2

Title of the Practice: Mentoring System

Objective

Mentoring system has been introduced to establish an effective student-teacher relationship and to guide the students in academic matters. It also help them in their overall developments. Mentoring students is a unique and interactive system. It is a process of creating a supporting relationship with parents and students aiming at comprehensive development of students. This relationship ensures better understanding of the students and to provide support to overcome their problems with the guidance of mentors. The mentor is responsible for providing support to the students in every sphere. Mentors serve as a moderator for students on their academic journey and help empower students to become autonomous learners and

agents of their own change. They boost the understanding of students and inspire them. They remove the fears from the students.

The Context

The process has been established as "Mentoring System". A mentor understands the problems of the students and helps them to overcome which is felt by the student both inside and outside the classroom. Necessary guidance in studies and career are also rendered by the mentor. A mentor even does the role of a counsellor conducting personal session with the students to solve their issues. Moreover the financially needy students are identified by each mentor and available scholarships are informed and arrange to acquire the same. Mentors also try to understand the psychology of the mentees and enhance the students' confidence and help them by setting higher goals, taking risks and ultimately guiding them to achieve higher levels. This system is important not only because of the academic issues, knowledge and skills students can learn from mentors but also because mentoring provides professional socialization and personal support to facilitate success. It enhances students' chance for success.

The Practice

Under this mentoring system, each faculty in our institute is the mentor of a group of 20 students. First Year students will have mentors from the department of Basic Science and Humanities. Other students have mentors from their concerned Departments. This ensures that every student is allotted a mentor. Students allocated to specific mentor will remain with him/her till the completion of the semester. Then for next semester, new mentors are appointed who are teaching the subjects to the respective class. The mentor establishes the contact with the parents through telephonic discussion, appraise them about the development of their wards. The mentee meets the mentors once in a fortnight and the observations about mentee viz. achievements, doubts, fears, grievances etc. are recorded. Based on which, the student is counselled in the necessary areas/ issues where he/she needs mentoring. This system bridges the gap between the teachers and students. It creates a better environment in college where students can approach teachers for both educational and personal guidance. Motivation for higher studies and entrepreneurship, advice and support for improvement in academic performance are also encouraged through this mentoring system. All mentors need to keep a harmonious relationship with the students. They maintain a brief but clear record of all discussion with students. Girl's students are especially under the guidance and responsibility of the lady faculties as far as possible. The Academic Committee of the institute discusses the mentoring related issues at least twice in a semester and revises or upgrade the system if necessary. The institute is also organizing parents' meeting once in a semester in different places nearest to their location for the convenience of the parents and providing information about the academic and psychological growth of the individual students. We have introduced "Let's Meet the Parents' under the mentoring system. Mentors meet the parents at their home and discuss with them about their wards' academic activities and get feedback. The HoDs and senior faculties always guide the faculties who are less than two years of experience about effective mentoring system. Mentors continuously monitor, counsel, guide and motivate the students.

Evidence of success

1. Students are disciplined and regular in the class is an output of this practice.

- 2. The positive feedback of the parents in the Parents' meeting about the mentoring system is an evidence of success.
- 3. This system inculcates human values among the students which make them disciplined and punctual.

Problems Encountered

- 1. Assessing mentee's background (knowledge and skills)
